

In 1983, they moved to Evergreen, where they helped establish Evergreen Christian Outreach, ministering to those in need for 10 years. In 1996, Paul and Barbie were called to begin a similar mission in Buena Vista. The Arkansas Valley Christian Mission opened in February 1997. Paul was an active servant in that ministry until his death.

Message from the Executive Director Sharon Smith

Programs have been developed to support people who may need help. For the past 27 years we have provided food to those in need and we currently feed over 300 unique households each month. Clothing and limited financial assistance have also always been available to our clients. Recognizing the need to do more, programs have been developed and implemented to help clients meet our mutual goal of sustainability and self-sufficiency. Our EChO Jobs program, educational classes, counselling and support groups, and classes to develop or learn new skills are all helping to create new beginnings for our mountain neighbors in need.

Spring is a time of renewal and re-energizing at Evergreen Christian Outreach. Many new and exciting events and programs continue to be added. Our two graduate school interns from Denver Seminary, Breanne Pedersen and Lauren Jennings, bring a wealth of knowledge and expertise to our counseling program. They continue to hold once a month Feel Good Bingo sessions at Green Ridge Meadows Apartments for the seniors who live there. The object is to help seniors identify and begin to deal with depression through these sessions and offer continuing counseling when needed. They have also developed three group workshops using art and music to bring another aspect of counseling to our clients.

The EChO Jobs Program continues to expand. Our two workshop presenters, Evergreen Chamber Volunteers



of The Year, Ken Carlson and Bruce Thoms, have developed a two hour, once per month, workshop for resume writing. They continue to hold the all day Jobs Workshop once a month. Ken and Bruce are also involved in the planning of our MOUNTAIN AREA JOB FAIR. This year we have combined efforts with Mountain Resource Center (MRC) to bring a job fair to our communities on Thursday, May 1, 2014 from 2p.m.- 5 p.m. at Aspen Ridge Church. This is a free event for the employers as well as the job seekers in our mountain community. We will hold a job fair twice a year continuing our working relationship with Moun-

tain Resource Center. The next job fair will be in the fall of this year. Please refer employers as well as job seekers to the Mountain Area Job Fair. We have developed a combined website with information about EChO's jobs programs as well as Mountain Resource Center's jobs program. The new website is www.mountainareajobs.org Register online for the job fair as well as workforce classes that continue to be offered regarding employment possibilities.

An additional workshop "Once You Have a Job How to Keep a Job" is scheduled for Monday, May 12, 2014 from 5 p.m. – 7 p.m. The presenter, Jim Rohrer, is very knowledgeable about this subject as he has written a book "Never Lose Your Job, Become a More Valuable Player". Please put this workshop on your calendar as it can improve your bottom line at work.

Our Budget Program Workshop presented by David Rommelmann continues to provide a clearer understanding of how to make the most of your income. What are the hidden costs and expenditures, how to balance your budget, and move yourself to a better understanding of sustainability and self-sufficiency. Call or look on our website for the next budget workshop scheduled.

We continue to extend a hand to our mountain neighbors in need through our programs as well as our other resources to provide sustainability/self-sufficiency, and hope on their journey toward independence. Food for Evergreen Children Comes Full Circle

Last fall, after the second successful summer lunch program at EChO, a newly formed group from Evergreen Rotary and Evergreen Lutheran Church inaugurated Mountain Backpacks. This initiative complements EChO's summer lunches, providing weekend breakfast and lunch for children in need during the school year. Backpacks are picked up right at the child's school on Fridays, full of nutritious ingredients, and are returned on Mondays to be refilled. Summer lunches supply weekday lunch ingredients when schools are not in session.

The Backpack group began with three students at Parmalee Elementary, and has expanded to 25 at that one school. The program is so well received that several other schools are asking to be included in next fall's effort! Wilmot and the Bergens are slated to join this coming August, and the backpack crew feels like they have the experience to handle it.

EChO helped Mountain Backpacks get rolling by publicizing it with our clients. Now they are returning the favor by promoting summer lunches to existing Backpackers and the new school administrations. What we have found is that the need for these programs is much greater than expected. These are the most sensitive members of our community to nutrition shortfall. At this summer's end, EChO will again let lunch recipients know about Backpacks at their schools.
