

Message from the Executive Director Sharon Smith

"When you do nothing, you feel overwhelmed and powerless. But when you get involved, you feel the sense of hope and accomplishment that comes from knowing you are working to make things better."

Isn't that a great quote? The first time I read this I immediately thought of our work here at EChO. Our staff, volunteers and supporters are all working to make things better for our neighbors and our community. Every day we are involved in "giving hope" to others – the hope for a better tomorrow.

When people first come to EChO, many are feeling overwhelmed and believe that they don't have many options to improve their situation. "I don't know what to do" is a common phrase heard during that initial interaction with staff. Many feel powerless, having had situations or life events turn their whole world upside down. It's amazing how quickly things can spiral out of control, even for folks who thought they were prepared to handle the ups and downs of life.

Getting people actively involved in their own life again is one of the gifts that we can offer our clients. It is so empowering to be told you have choices, and there are options! Our first priority at EChO is dealing with the immediate and most urgent needs that an individual may have. For many, it's not having enough food to eat or their utilities have been turned off. Often times there is a big sigh of relief, or even tears, when help is offered to address these needs. When a big burden is lifted from your shoulders it is easier to look forward to the future with hope. Programs such as the EChO Jobs Center and our education assistance funding help get individuals excited about the possibilities that may be available to them.

And our clients are not the only ones benefiting from their interactions at EChO. Staff and volunteers see firsthand the transformation that is possible when help is given, and there is no better feeling than knowing you have made a difference in someone's life. To our many donors and supporters – your generosity makes this happen. Perhaps you have brought food to the food bank, donated clothing or furniture to Resale or St Raphael's, purchased gifts at Christmas to donate to those who may not be able to afford gifts, attended an ECho fundraiser, made a financial contribution on Colorado Gives Day or made a donation on-line or by check; or perhaps you donated your time and talents by offering your services to others – you are a true giver of hope and we thank you. EChO's Client Services

Cathy Baim, Director of Client Services

As we recover from our country's national recession/depression, most individuals needing assistance are grateful EChO is here to help sustain them during their time of need. The goal of EChO Client Services is to move those seeking assistance toward sustainability, give them hope and education. The programs EChO has developed to assist in their movement forward toward sustainability are:

EChO Jobs Programs:

- Individuals sign up for an <u>all day</u> workshop to discuss how to improve their job search possibilities. The workshops are held once a month from 8 am to 4 pm
- Once individuals complete the workshop, they are assigned a job coach who works with them one-on-one helping with resumes, introduction letters, experience practicing interview skills, and etc.
- The next step whether they have a job or not is to attend a <u>half-day</u> workshop on 'Once You Have a Job, How to Keep It'. This workshop is held once a month.
- Our first 'EChO **Job Fair**' will be held Thursday, November 7, from 9 am to 1 pm at Wulf Recreation Center. Employers from the community will be present. The job fair is open to our mountain community.
- Best Foot Forward is our equivalent to Dress for Success and is located upstairs at St. Raphael's, EChO's resale for clients. An appointment is needed to access the special clothing available for job seekers that have attended our EChO's Jobs Program. The clothing is for job interviews, and/or appropriate work clothing once a job is attained.

Budgeting Program: A once a month <u>half-day</u> workshop to explore how to budget effectively for yourself and family.

Divorce Group: A 10-session divorce group meets on Mondays from 6:30-8 pm Both divorced or soon to be divorced men and women are invited to join.

Counseling: Individual and family counseling is available to our clients at no charge. (We currently have two graduate students from Denver Seminary who can meet with those needing counseling assistance.)

The response to these programs has been very positive. Almost half of the job seekers who have attended the jobs workshop are employed. Once job seekers attend the workshop and are assigned a job coach, their attitude and outlook become more positive. We have even had a few job seekers attend the workshop for a second time for a refresher course—an attitude enhancer

These programs are open to those in our mountain community as well as individuals in need of other services EChO provides. Please help us spread the word about EChO's programs. Thank you for your support of EChO!

One of the Job Seminar participants (pictured on front page) was the first patron of the Career Closet. Her job coach was unavailable so wardrobe consultation was provided by the St. Raphaels crew. She was outfitted from head to toe. For everyone involved it was an inspirational experience. Her confidence and self-esteem are evident in the photo. Her interview was the next day. She was hired and started her new job on October 1.

In her words: "At a time when there is a lot of economic uncertainty, not having a job or leaving your job to make a career change can be quite challenging and stressful. I knew that for every job available in my field of expertise there was a significant amount of applicants seeking the same job opportunities. By attending the job seminar, and receiving the ongoing guidance and support from my job coach, I was able to focus on possibilities instead of barriers to employment, and to develop a new vision for my job search and career.

EChO Gardens with EAS+Y Jim Shelton, Food Bank Manager



We are gardeners! Evergreen Sustainability + You (EAS+Y) organized a community garden in Buchanan Park this spring, and EChO was right there helping to build it, to garden in our plot, and to encourage our clients to do their own gardening.

Growing healthy food directly is a great way to ensure food security, learn where our food comes from, and increase the amount of organic food in our diets. Big thanks go to Rachel Emmer of EAS+Y who involved the Food Bank in planning two years ago and successfully brought the garden to reality this May.

We have four EChO clients with plots, made affordable by a half scholarship from EChO for plot rental. There were a number of Food Bank volunteers helping EChO and EAS+Y throughout planning, construction, and maintenance, especially Jay Tierney and Richard Bamerick. Evergreen Rotarians lead by Hanna Holt and Ted Ning gardened their plot on our behalf. We initiated an EChO box at the garden where other folks could leave their surplus for our clients.

Thanks go to the Parks family for getting our plot organized and equipped, to Christine Emery and RMAE volunteers for weeding, watering, and harvesting (see picture) through the summer, Evergreen Rotary for supporting our needs with their produce, and Pat Korbel with Liz Hawkins who created EChO signage in the garden. Also, thanks to Pat for stepping in mid-summer to keep our plot moving forward, including delivering its bounty to the Food Bank.

We garnered nearly 400 pounds of produce from the Community Garden in spite of the "biblical" weather this year! With planning and an early start next year, we expect to significantly increase this result. Adding to this effort was produce from the Bergen Farmers' Market, Safeway, and Walmart. Fresh food is a valuable ingredient for our clients' healthy diet!
